'Miss Condom' Contest Blows Competition Away

BANGKOK (Reuters) - A bevy of Thai bar girls, health officials and a transvestite blew up condoms and paraded for a different kind of honor - the title of "Miss Condom Asia-Pacific."

Featuring 20 contestants from four different nations, the contest aims to promote safe sex in Thailand - a country on the frontline in the war against HIV/AIDS in Asia.

But instead of twirling batons or warbling show

tunes, "Miss Condom" competitors wowed the judges with their condom-blowing prowess and knowledge about the virus, which has infected over seven million people across the region.

"It's education plus entertainment," said Sen. Mechai Viravaidya, known as "Mr. Condom" for his work in promoting AIDS awareness in Thailand. He said the 20-year-old contest helps to remove the stigma of condom use in a nation still

ruled by conservative social mores.

Thailand, where infection rates are falling after a campaign to promote condoms among commercial sex workers, is one of the region's rare success stories.

While infection rates are far lower in Asia than in southern Africa, the global epicenter of the disease, the Asia-Pacific region could account for 40 percent of new infections by 2010 if prevention efforts are not stepped up.
